Recommended Vaccination Protocol

***For older kittens and adult cats or strays*

This estimate/protocol is provided for your convenience only. **This is only an estimate of services.** Treatment may be altered to better fit each individual cat's needs. If you have any questions during an appointment about additional costs, we are happy to provide further information. Our vaccinations are the most advanced available, and are less likely to cause vaccine reactions. Our Feline Leukemia vaccine is a needle-less vaccine.

Kittens age 13 weeks old and older.

(Also for adult cats or stray cats who've never been vaccinated or history is unknown)

General Information

Physical Exams and Some Vaccinations are recommended annually. The first year or when a history is unknown however, your cat will need additional boosters on their vaccinations to ensure full immunity.

Rabies is required to be given once per year according to state law by a licensed veterinarian.

Feline Distemper Vaccine is required for any stay in our kennel facility for surgery, boarding, or general drop-offs.

Parasites in kittens/stray cats are common which is why we recommend a stool check at each visit. There is no additional charge to check your cats stool for parasites. If you are able to bring a stool sample from the litter box, please do so.

Heartworm Prevention is recommended for all cats, even indoor only cats. We offer two options for heartworm prevention in cats.

- **Revolution** is a topical treatment, applied monthly, which also protects your cat against fleas, ear mites, hookworms, and roundworms.
- **Heartgard** is a chewable treat, given monthly, which also protects your cat against hookworms and roundworms.

***Feline Leukemia/FIV (Feline Immunodeficiency Virus)** are diseases that we recommend all cats/kittens are tested for. These are diseases your cat/kitten may or may not show symptoms of. They will suppress the immune system of your cat making it harder to fight off infections. There is no cure for Feline Leukemia and FIV; however, there are things we can do to help boost your cat's immune system if positive. Feline Leukemia and FIV are highly contagious to other cats. A vaccination is also available for FIV, Feline Immunodeficiency Virus and is recommended for cats that go outdoors and fight. They are at a higher risk for that disease. Please feel free to ask us for additional information on Feline Leukemia/FIV diseases in cats.
